- Trees are bare root and sold in single species bundles, or in Wildlife, or Nut & Berry Bundles.

- The trees are for conservation projects and are not to be resold.

Chakaharry Black	Eull Cup to	Moist to wet; bogs, swamps, open shrubby			Open unright careading rounded but leaguishrub Spring
Chokeberry, Black Aronia melanocarpa	Full Sun to Part Shade	wetlands, forest openings	3 - 6'	4 - 10'	Open, upright, spreading, rounded but leggy shrub. Spring flowers; fall berries and attractive foliage. Great for wildlife.
Cranberrybush Viburnum trilobum	Full Sun to Part Sun	Moist soil; forest edges, clearings, swamps, fens, shores, banks	8 - 12'	2 - 4'	Beautiful soft maple-like leaves with white lace-cap flowers in spring and shiny red berries by August. Great for wildlife.
Dogwood, Redosier Cornus sericea	Full Sun to Part Shade	Open wetlands; tolerant of diverse soil types	6 - 8'	4 - 8'	Rapid-growing, multi-stemmed; spring flowers, late summer fruit, reddish purple fall leaves and bright red winter stems.
Hazelnut, American Corylus americana	Full Sun to Part Shade	Moist to dry; open woods, thickets, savanna, prairie	8 - 15'	15 - 18'	Rounded, multi-stemmed shrub with both male and female flowers on same plant. Edible nuts in July/August.
Elderberry, American NEW Sambucus canadensis	Full Sun to Part Shade	Moist; floodplains, ditches, thickets, wood- land and marsh edges & meadows	4 - 13'	5 - 8'	Fast growing. Blooms late summer. Edible, when ripe, purple-black berries late summer to fall. Fruit attracts birds.
Nannyberry Viburnum lentago	Full Sun to Part Shade	Moist soil; hardwood forest openings, wet meadows	12 - 15'	8 - 10'	Large, leggy, can be pruned to a small tree form. Spring flowers - deep maroon/red & fruit in fall. Great for wildlife.
Ninebark, Common Physocarpus opulifolius	Full Sun to Part Shade	Rocky or sandy soil, cliffs, shores, bluffs, stream banks, moist woods	6 - 10′	4 - 6'	Spreading, coarse and densely-branched; late spring flowers, clusters of reddish fruit, peeling bark. Great for wildlife.
Plum, American Prunus americana	Sun	Fields, prairies, woodlands, forest edges, roadsides, along sores	12 - 20'	6 - 12'	Large shrub, can form large colonies. Flowers and edible fruit, hardy, drought resistant, excellent for wildlife planting.
Serviceberry (Juneberry) Amelanchier alnifolia	Full Sun to Shade	Prefers loam soils, tolerates sand and clay. Needs well-drained soil	4 - 6'	5 - 12'	White spring flowers, yellow to red fall foliage, smooth gray bark, and edible purple fruit. Excellent wildlife plant.
Birch, Paper Betula papyrifera	Full Sun to Part Shade	Rich, well-drained soils; upland forest	50 - 70'	8 - 18'	Very hardy, fairly rapid growing. Bark turns chalk-white as tree matures and peels off in strips.
Birch, River Betula nigra	Full Sun to Part Shade	Moist, sand through clay soils; floodplain forest	40 - 70'	8 - 16′	Multi-stemmed desired, graceful branching, heat tolerant, seeds attract birds. Brown, papery bark peels into curls.
Cherry, Black Prunus serotina	Full Sun to Shade	Moist, rich, well drained soils; hardwood forest	50 - 75'	14 - 20'	A large cherry tree, profuse spring flowers followed by small red cherries, attractive summer foliage and fall color.
Hackberry Celtis occidentalis	Sun	Average to moist soil; hardwood forest, floodplains, river banks	30 - 50'	12 - 20'	Used as shade or boulevard tree, year-round interest. Fruit is edible and highly nutritious; popular with birds.
Maple, Red Acer rubrum	Full Sun to Part Shade	Moist, well-drained sand to clay; along shores, hardwood swamps	40 - 60'	8 - 18'	Fast growing, red flower clusters in spring, fall foliage usually red but may be yellow/orange. Landscape/shade tree.
Maple, Sugar Acer saccharum	Full Sun to Shade	Moist, well drained, sandy loam to silty loam; mesic forest	60 - 100'	8 - 20'	Slow growing, bright green leaves that turn yellow to scarlet in the fall. Tree to tap for syrup making.
Oak, Bur Quercus macrocarpa	Sun	Moist, well drained sand to clay; forest to open prairie	70 - 80'	10 - 18'	Slow growing, very drought tolerant, yellow/orange fall color, excellent shade/wildlife tree. Large, fringed acorns.
Oak, Red (Northern) Quercus rubra	Sun	Heavier, well drained soil; forest	60 - 80'	8 - 20′	Fastest growing oak, dense, lustrous foliage. Red fall color, leaves hang on tree into winter. Acorns prized by wildlife.
Oak, Swamp White Quercus bicolor	Sun	Silty, moist flood plain soils	50 - 60'	10 - 18'	Special concern in MN, good for wetter/low sites; good drought resistance. Acorns messy, but good food source.
Oak, White Quercus alba	Sun	Moist to dry, well drained soil; deciduous forest, upland slopes	60 - 100'	10 - 20'	Slow growing, leaves are dark green to slightly blue-green in summer, brown and wine-red to orange-red in the fall.
Hickory, Shagbark Carya ovata	Full Sun to Part Shade	Moist well-drained, fertile soils. Will tolerate range of sand-to clay	70 - 80'	10 - 20'	Large, slow to moderate growth. Sweet edible nuts in 8 –10 yrs. Shaggy peeling bark. Deep tap root.
Cedar, Eastern Red Juniperous virginiana	Full Sun to Part Shade	Sandy, rocky soil; forests, meadows, fields, woodlands, and prairies , swamps	25 - 80'	4 - 20'	Medium growth. Important food and shelter source for many wildlife species.
Fir, Balsam Abies balsamea	Full Sun to Part Shade	Moist to wet, peat swamps, moist upland forests	40 –60'	10 - 16'	Slow growing, excellent for Christmas trees, wildlife cover and food. Moderately tolerant of extreme winds.
Pine, White Pinus strobus	Full Sun to Part Shade	Moist, well drained, loamy; upland forest	80 - 120'	10 - 18'	Fast growing, long, soft needle, good for windbreaks and wildlife cover, nesting and food.
Pine, Red NEW Pinus resinosa	Full Sun	Acidic, well-drained soils. Tolerates varied moisture levels & poor, rocky, or sandy soil	60 - 120'	7 - 10'	Fast growing, long lived, dark green needles. Habitat and food source for songbirds and small mammals. MN State tree!
Spruce, White Picea glauca	Sun to Part Shade	Moist, sandy loam to clay; upland forest	40 - 60'	8 - 16'	Moderate growth rate, dense foliage, good wildlife cover and food, needles/cones hang down, Christmas tree.
